KEY QUALIFICATIONS

Ms. El-Mahdi has over 20 years of experience in economic management at both the macro and micro levels. At the macro level, close exposure (2002-2004) to the workings of the Ministry of Finance and National Economy in Sudan has added to her knowledge and expertise in matters related to macroeconomic policy formulation and public finance management. Her specific portfolio of international financial relations meant that she gained experience in negotiations with international and regional financial institutions financing the country's development projects. Ms. El-Mahdi's ministerial responsibilities included debt management and dealing with the country's debt problem. Her experience in formulating the national Poverty Eradication Strategy brought her into close contact with many aspects of the Sudanese economy that must be dealt with in the context of the strategy that included, among many other aspects, the inadequacy of intergovernmental transfers as well as fiduciary arrangements in the states and their localities.

Previous management, economic analysis and research experience was gained at the 'Economic Research Forum for Arab Countries, Iran & Turkey' in Cairo where she worked first as a Research Officer and later as a consultant. She gained seven years experience (1995 – 2002) during that period in managing their research project on Labor Markets and Human Resource Development in the MENA Region.

Her knowledge of international financial markets as well as the economies of African countries was enhanced by her two year experience with the International Monetary Fund. There she gained experience in the economic reform programs designed by international organizations and their relationship with member countries.

Since 2005, she has been managing UNICONS Consultancy Ltd. an independent economic consultancy firm based in Khartoum, Sudan. This entails, among others, setting the firm's strategy, mapping its way forward as well as managing its day to day activities. In implementing consultancy projects assigned to the firm, Ms. El-Mahdi has been involved as Project manager and task leader overseeing all aspects of the project including design, technical and logistical as well as evaluation aspects. The firm's work in formulating a strategy for the development of the microfinance sector in Sudan and its work in the establishment of a microfinance institution in Southern Sudan have contributed greatly to her practical knowledge in this field. Moreover, her close involvement in the National Stakeholder Consultations for the Fiscal, Financial, Allocation and Monitoring Commission (FFAMC) has given her insight in the critical issues related to inter and intra state fiscal transfers in Sudan. This was further researched by her in the work she undertook for the UNDP in Public Expenditure Management.

More recently, Ms. El-Mahdi has been researching the economic impact on Sudan of Secession of its Southern part and has produced three papers in this connection. Ms. El-Mahdi is also economic advisor to the Japanese Embassy as well member of the Board of Directors of financial and commercial entity.


